The Prayer Of Mary

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord, my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for he has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed: the Almighty has done great things for me, and holy is his Name. He has mercy on those who fear him in every generation. He has shown the strength of his arm, he has scattered the proud in their conceit. He has cast down the mighty from their thrones, and has lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has come to the help of his servant Israel for he remembered his promise of mercy, the promise he made to our fathers, to Abraham and his children forever.

(Lk 1:46-55)

How does the Church teach?

In his last words to the apostles, Jesus gave them a mission: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Mt 28:19-20)

Thus, the teaching mission of the Church comes from Christ himself. The responsibility for fulfilling that mandate passes on unchanged to the bishops and to all Catholics. Within each Catholic diocese, the diocesan bishop is its principal teacher. He is assisted by clergy, religious, and lay men and women who serve as educators and catechists in Catholic institutions, including elementary and secondary schools, colleges and universities, seminaries and parishes. Catechesis is the act of handing on the Word of God intended to inform the faith community and candidates for initiation into the Church about the teachings of Christ transmitted by the Apostles. It also involves the lifelong effort of forming people into witnesses to Christ and opening their hearts to the spiritual transformation given by the Holy Spirit. The teaching authority of the Catholic Church, called the Magisterium, lies with all of the bishops who are led by the pope and guided by the Holy Spirit. The pope and bishops are the authoritative teachers in the Church.

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

Párrafo 966

"Finalmente la Virgen Inmaculada, conservada libre de toda mancha de Pecado original, cuando se terminó el curso de su vida terrenal, fue Llevado cuerpo y alma a la gloria celestial, y exaltado por el Señor como reina sobre todas las cosas, para que ella sea la más completa Se conformó a su Hijo, Señor de los señores y conquistador del pecado y de la muerte. "La Asunción de la Santísima Virgen es una Participación singular en la Resurrección de su Hijo y Anticipación de la resurrección de otros cristianos: Al dar a luz conservaste tu virginidad; En tu Dormición no abandonaste el mundo, oh Madre de Dios, sino que te uniste a la fuente de la Vida. Vosotros concebisteis al Dios vivo y, por vuestras oraciones, Librará nuestras almas de la muerte.

¿Cómo enseña la Iglesia?

En sus últimas palabras a los apóstoles, Jesús les dio una misión: "Id, pues, y haced discípulos de todas las naciones,

Bautizándolos en el nombre de la Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo, enseñándoles a guardar todo lo que yo os he mandado" (Mt 28, 19-20) Así, la misión docente de la Iglesia proviene del mismo Cristo. La responsabilidad

de cumplir ese mandato pasa sin cambios a los obispos ya todos los católicos. Dentro de cada diócesis católica, el obispo diocesano es su Maestro principal Él es asistido por Clero, religiosos y laicos y Mujeres que sirven como educadoras y Catequistas en las instituciones católicas,

Incluyendo escuelas primarias y secundarias, colegios y universidades, Seminarios y parroquias. La catequesis es el acto de entregar la Palabra de Dios destinada a informar a la comunidad de fe ya los candidatos a la iniciación en la Iglesia sobre las enseñanzas de Cristo transmitidas por los Apóstoles.

También Implica el esfuerzo de toda la vida de formar personas en testigos de

Cristo y abrir sus corazones a la transformación espiritual dada por el Espíritu Santo. La autoridad docente de la Iglesia Católica, llamada Magisterio, está con todos los obispos que son guiados por el Papa y guiados por el Santo Espíritu. Catechism of the Catholic Church Paragraph 966

"Finally the Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, so that she might be the more fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death." The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin is a singular participation in her Son's Resurrection and an anticipation of the resurrection of other Christians:

In giving birth you kept your virginity; in your Dormition you did not leave the world, O Mother of God, but were joined to the source of Life. You conceived the living God and, by your prayers, will deliver our souls from death.



And the angel said to her in reply, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. Therefore the child to be born will be called holy, the Son of God.
